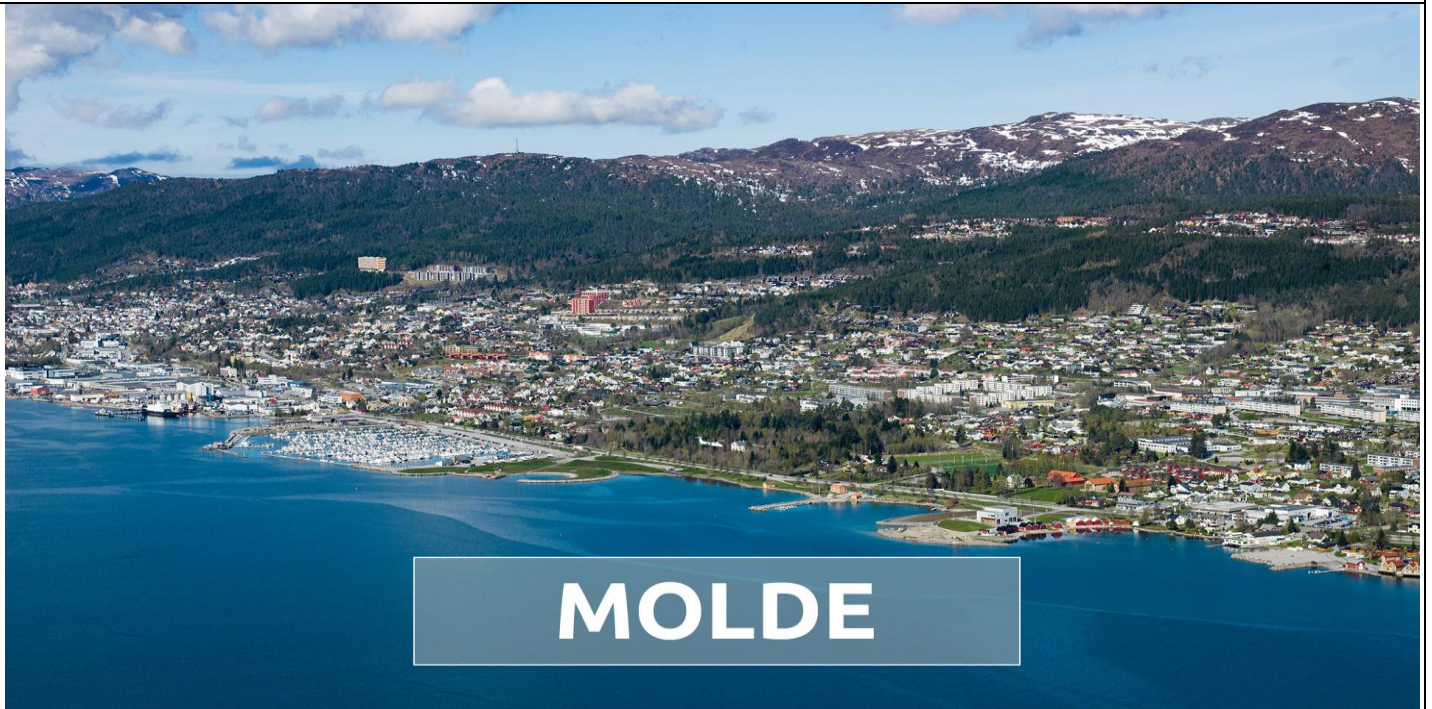


MOLDE (CITY)



Driving: 50 minutes (55 km). Drive RV665 to Molde.

Why do we recommend this trip?

The city has a protected location at the foot of the hills of Molde. Here it blooms more roses in the city garden than anywhere else. Witch gave Molde the title of "City of Roses". Nature defies the situation on the northern latitudes and chestnuts, maple, linden, ash and beech trees like it here.

Molde is the capital of the Møre and Romsdal districts. Merchant city since 1742 with timber trade and sawmill as the most important fabric. From the middle of the 19th century, the city developed into the regional trade and administrative center.

Many of Norway's great poets such as Bjørnstjerne Bjørnson, Henrik Ibsen, Alexander Kielland and Edvard Hoem are connected to the city in various ways.

Nowadays, Molde is a commercial and industrial city, educational center and tourist city. The city is internationally known for its famous jazz festival (Molde Jazz) which takes place every year in the second week of July.

MOLDEPANORA – VARDEN

With its 87 snow-capped peaks from east to west and the Romsdal mountains in the middle, you have the best view of the panorama from the VARDEN (407 m asl). A road leads there and there is a summer cafeteria on the top.



ROMSDALSMUSEET

The museum has a collection of over 60 typical old houses. Here you can visit the different types of houses that used to belong to a farm.

MOLDE CITY HALL – city center

The town hall was built in 1966. There is a park on the roof with rose beds, fountains and benches for visitors.
