THE FISCHERMEN VILLAGE BUD

In the 16th and 17th centuries, Bud was the largest trading center between Bergen and Trondheim. The last imperial meeting, independent of Denmark, was held here in Norway in 1533 under the direction of Archbishop Olav Engelbrektsson. Today Bud is an active and charming fishing village with several good fish restaurants.



BUD MUSEUM – ERGAN COAST FORTRESS

German coastal fortress, built during the war (1940-45), today restored as a war memorial. Exhibitions on local and regional events in World War II. Ergan is also a great viewpoint point over the fishing village of Bud and the atlantic coast of Hustadvika.



Large parts of Norway were occupied during the Second World War and Bud was one of those places that were under control from 1940-1945. There are several historical war memorials (with information boards) along the Bud-Kristiansund route.
