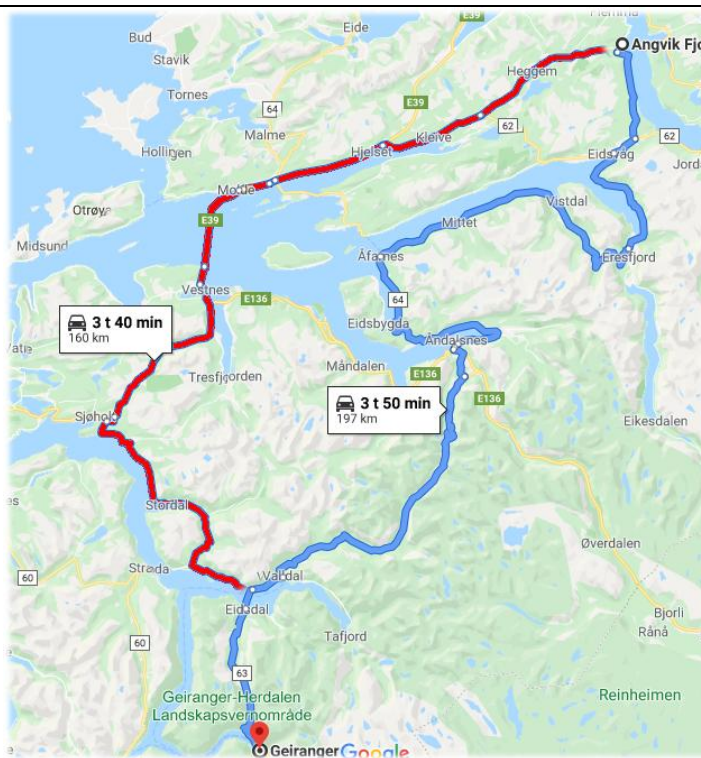


GEIRANGER (VILLAGE)

The Geirangerfjord is the most visited fjord in Norway, and is visited by many cruise ships. The place has 4 hotels and many campsites. In the summer you can experience the unique nature with its steep mountain walls by boat from the fjord.

ØRNEVEIEN – EAGLE ROAD

The "Eagle Walk", completed in 1954, leads from Geiranger to Eidsdal and winds up the mountain side with 11 curves. In one of the curves is a lookout point with a magnificent view of Geiranger and the surrounding high mountains

FLYDALSJUVET

On the other side of Geiranger a road leads up to the Flydals Gorge (Juvet) at medium height. From here you can take pictures of the famous "Geiranger motif". The motif is the most used image in the advertisement for holidays in Norway.



DALSNIBBA

If you drive up the Geiranger road, which was built in 1889, you reach the top after 17 km. From here, a toll road goes up to Dalsnibba 1495 meters above sea level. From there you have a one-time and fantastic view over the Geirangerfjord and the mountains around it.



GEIRANGER CHURCH

The octagonal church dates from 1842, the altarpiece and decorations are made by the woodcarver Einar Flydal.
